## The Americans with Disabilities Act Celebrating 35 Years!



On July 26, 2025, marks the **35**th anniversary of the **Americans With Disabilities Act (ADA)**. Signed by former President George H.W. Bush in 1990, this civil rights law prohibits the discrimination against people with disabilities and ensure the same opportunities as those without disabilities. This includes public and private areas such as state and local government agencies, telecommunications, schools, jobs, and transportation. The ADA protect the civil rights of individuals with disabilities on the basis of race, color, age, national origin, and religion as well. The ADA is divided into five titles:

- 1. **Employment (Title I):** Prohibit discrimination in employment against individuals with disabilities.
- 2. Public Services (Title II): Ensure equal access of state and government services and programs.
- 3. Public Accommodations (Title III): Ensure public accommodations in places such as restaurants, stores, and hotels are accessible and modified. Barriers to service is removed for existing places.
- 4. **Telecommunications** (**Title IV**): Telephone and internet companies provide accessible services for individuals with speech and hearing disabilities.
- 5. **Miscellaneous** (**Title V**): Provisions containing the relationship between the ADA and other laws, prohibition against retaliation and coercion.

## Summer Heat Wave Helpful Tips to Stay Cool and Save Energy

Summer is finally here and temperatures are beginning to rise. It is important to know how to stay safe, cool and comfortable as well as taking control of your energy bills. Below are a list of

control of your energy bills. Below helpful tips to prepare yourself:



- Set your air conditioning unit to 76-78°F.
- Keep blinds and drapes closed or cover windows during daylight hours.
- Wear and reapply sunscreen regularly (SPF 15+).
- Delay running heat-producing appliances until after 8 pm.
- Wear lightweight, loose-fitting clothing and avoid dark colors on hot days to stay cool.
- Sit in shaded areas as much as you can.
- Avoid overexertion, especially between 11:00 am and 6:00 pm.
- Drink water every 20 minutes if not thirsty in order to stay hydrated.
- If your home is hot, go to a local library, mall, or cooling center to cool
  down.
