In September, consumers from the DIAL Recreation Program went on a field trip to the Creator's Workshop in Wayne, New Jersey. This workshop offers hands-on sessions focusing on a specific skill or technique, such as brushwork to create original pieces of art. The project was an autumn themed painting. Instructors Michael and Jennifer taught consumers different painting techniques to enhance their portraits such as painting vertically which makes the sky look more realistic and painting the ocean horizontally which makes the ocean look like it is moving. Everyone got to take home their original paintings and could not wait to hang them!

David Pardave, an educator from the Passaic County Health Department came to the program and gave a presentation on recycling. He explained the recycling process of varied materials such as paper and plastic. He also spoke about diverse ways you can reuse recyclable materials.
